

CITATION

The Geelong West Post Office in Pakington Street was
 designed in 1885 by western region architect of the Public
 Works Department, G.B.H. Austin, as an eclectically derived
 style which is characteristic of his work. The foundation
 stone was laid by Graeme Berry, Chief Secretary and the
 Building was completed in 1886. The post office exemplifies
 the innovative and eclectic nature of Public Works
 Department architecture of the 1880's in Victoria and has
 many counterparts throughout Victoria.
