Description This timber school building at 51-53 Mount Pleasant Road is situated to the south-west of the original brick school building on the site. It is also partially visible from Mount Pleasant Road, but clearly visible across the open playground and oval from Thompson and Regent Streets. From these streets the building makes a significant contribution to the predominantly single storey streetscape.						
The single storey, painted weatherboard Federation school building is characterised by a steeply pitched gable roof form with a minor gable projecting from the western end. These roofs are clad in galvanised corrugated iron. Wide overhangs are a feature of the eaves, as are the plain timber bargeboards which were once adorned with timber members forming flying gables as shown in a photograph dated 1911. ² The early timber framed double hung windows are arranged in triplet on the east facade, with upper hopper sash windows. Each window is 15 paned. The early timber framed side windows form hopper sashes and each contain four panes. The timber door on the minor gabled section appears to be early, as are the gable ventilators. The original ventilation roof stacks and guttering have been removed (the guttering replaced with a more contemporary, inappropriate square profile)

History The weatherboard School building at 51-53 Mount Pleasant Road appears to have been constructed in c.1912 as the new school building for the Flinders Peak School on the south-west corner of School and Forest Roads, Lara. ¹ This school had been closed in 1899 and reopened in 1907, when the earlier building was renovated. ^{1,2} However, the unhealthy condition of the earlier building led to the construction of this weatherboard structure (now at Belmont). ¹ According to L.J. Blake in <i>Vision and Realisation</i> , this school was closed on 28 June, 1944, and this building was used until at least the early 1970s by the Ranger of the You Yangs reserve. ¹ However, it is known that the building was removed to Armytage in the Western District and used as a rural training school. ³ In May 1950, the building it across the Barwon River bridge at Winchelsea and the bridge at Waurn Ponds, as a photograph of 24 May, 1950, indicates. ^{3,4}

EET	Statement of Cultural Significance The weatherboard School building at 51-53 Mount Pleasant Road is aesthetically significant at a LOCAL level. It demonstrates original design qualities of the Federation style for wooden school buildings. These qualities include the painted weatherboards, steeply pitched gable roof form with a minor gable projecting from the western end, galvanised corrugated iron roof cladding, wide eaves, timber framed double hung windows arranged in triplet on the east facade with upper hopper sash windows whereby each window is 15 paned. Other intact qualities include the timber framed side windows forming hopper sashes and containing four panes, side timber door, and the gable ventilators. The two-roomed hall design appears to be a derivative of the Education Department's "standard design for a wooden school to accommodate forty children", popular for rural schools from the 1870s. The weatherboard school building at 51-53 Mount Pleasant Road is <i>historically</i> significant at a LOCAL level. It is associated with the State Education Department and the education of school children in Lara, Armytage and Belmont. The weatherboard school building at 51-53 Mount Pleasant Road is <i>socially</i> significant at a LOCAL level. It is recognised and valued by the Geelong region for reasons of educational associations. Overall, the weatherboard school building at 51-53 Mount Pleasant Road is of LOCAL significance.
