The early timber framed windows under the verandah and at the side are double hung, while the timber framed double hung windows forming a bay on the street facade may be recent. History The site at 1 Vivian Street originally formed lot 16 of the Vivian Estate subdivision of c.1890. ¹ This house may have been constructed as early as 1895 for Thomas Price, and he was listed as the owner in 1899-1900. ¹ By 1901-02, the house had been sold to Alfred and Alexander Hughan, and William Horwood, farmers and vignerons. ¹ By 1906-07, William Henry Lugg, a grocer had purchased the property and he lived there until 1909-10, when he sold it to Stanley Holmes, a foreman. ¹ Eight years later in 1918-19, he sold the property to Herbert Lewis, shop assistant and only one year later it was again sold, this time to William and E.A.
