I can tell you that the "Asbury J.C." was 154 Lance Corporal John Charles Asbury, A Coy 20 Bn AIF who was wounded on 5 May 1916 in France and died on 8 May 1916 at 8CCS. Buried in Bailleul Communal Cemetery Extension, France. Plot 2, Row D, Grave No. 39.

Cause of Death: Shell wounds in abdomen, received in action.

I have copies of his records to authenticate this.

I hope that this is of use to you.
