ARCHDALE honor Board from the Great War 1914-1918  
*Reported by Bev Trower on behalf of her father Eric David Trower.*

After the war the Archdale community contributed to the cost of an Honor Board, in memory of the young men from the Archdale district who went to the 1914-1918 Great War. Generous donations for that era, were from 1/- one shilling=10 cents, 5/- five shillings or crown = 50 cents, 2/6d two shillings and six pence = 25 cents. The blackwood Honor Roll Board with 12 names thereon, in gold letters, was obtained through Mr. Edwin J. Peck, Bealiba. The price of the Honor Board was six pounds ten shillings, was paid in cash on 12/12/1921. Receipt from Edwin J. Peck, in his handwriting stated - Nov 1 To 1 Blackboard Honor Roll ( lettered) 6 pound ten shillings. Paid in Cash 20/12/1921. Please return to M. Isaac, Archdale. (Maurice Isaac was the school teacher at that time)

\* Private EVANS, Gilbert George Henry 148, 21st Battalion Australian  
Infantry, died of wounds 30/7/1916 age 23 years.

The Honor Board was placed in the Archdale School. When the School was closed in 1942, the Board was relocated in the Archdale Methodist Church where it remained until the Church building was demolished in the 1960's.

The Archdale Honor Board was then transferred to the Bealiba Hall where it  
still remains today. (1999)
