were planted in memory of two Wright brothers. Near the Hairdresser's shop on the corner (formerly Albert and May Legge's grocer's shop 'The Big Store') was a tree planted in memory of ,

1062. Cpl. F. Wright. .. 7th Batt. A.I.F.

Enlisted 8th Sept. 1914 K.I.A. Gallipoli'

'M.I.D. by Sir Ian Hamilton for conspicuous bravery in the field and was recommended for the V.C

On the opposite side of the road was the tree planted in memory of Cpl. F Wright's brother:

'1440. Pt. S. Wright. 15th Batt. A.I.F.

Enlisted Oct. 1914 K.I.A. 7th Aug. 1915

Previously reported missing Served at Gallipoli

A third brother, Sam Wright, was resident in Emerald for many years.
