Why important?: A very good example of the adapted Georgian style that

evolved at this period. This design would have been innovative for the period with the bold simple roof forms, fenestration and massing and the use of

roughcast for the entire building. Particular refinements are provided by the slender tapered chimneys, the elegant glazing of the projecting front bays, the open terrace and loggia, and projecting entry porch. The

fence and gates complement the design and feature unusual tapered piers. The intervals between the piers have been infilled with brickwork in lieu of iron

(presumably to match the gates). Otherwise extremely

intact. Possibly a progenitor for a significant

architectural style in Melbourne.
