# History

#### **Description**

Red brick with cemented detail, the house has notable elements of Beebe's architecture in its use of the Queen Anne revival style, the parapet being reminiscent of the Fuse Factory (q.v.) and the oculus of the Lansell residence in nearby View Street. Some original pickets remain.

#### **External Integrity**

Generally original.

## Landscape

Remnant landscape includes a Canary Island date palm.

#### Context

Sited at the corner of View Street, the house is prominent and opposite the Park View Hotel and close to the other Beebe designed doctor's surgery further south in View Street.

#### **Significance**

Architecturally, the house has distinctive detailing, a prominent location and is close to original condition. It also contributes to a group of individually notable sites, some linked by Beebe's design and others by a common era.

Historically, as the long-term house and surgery of a doctor, it takes on a quasi-public building role as a place known by many Bendigonians early this century.
