History

Most of the funds for the erection of this hall were raised by public subscription. A further £2000 were voted by Bendigo City Council to enable the entire design to be carried into effect. The site was formerly occupied by the Hustlers Royal Reserve Mine on the edge of Rosalind Park. Water and gases are said to still escape from the capped shaft, into the Bendigo Creek, behind the hall. The memorial hall was opened on 15 November, 1921, by the Governor of Victoria. An Honour Roll, also raised by public subscription, names those Bendigonians who served in the Great War. It was unveiled on Anzac Day, 1926. The designers, Beebe & Garvin, were reduced to one (G.D.Garvin) by the date of opening.
