

CITATION The J.F. Archibald Memorial marks the birthplace of one of Australia's most accomplished and dedicated Journalists, and founder of the celebrated Bulletin in 1880. The Archibald Fountain in Sydney, The Archibald Prize for portrait painting, and The Australian Journalists Association benevolent fund are also established in memory of this great Australian writer, and as a consequence of generous bequests in the will of Jules Francois Archibald. Born at Kildare (North Geelong) Archibald, baptised as John Feltham (later changed to Jules Francois in a period of Francophile passion) lived only a short time in Geelong.
