

HISTORY: This late Victorian timber house was built in 1901 for grocer, Edwin Hooper.<sup>1</sup>

VISUAL DESCRIPTION: A double-fronted, hip-roofed, timber late Victorian house. The left bay projects as a gable, with timbered roughcast upper section, over a skillion, ripple-iron hood, with ogee gutter and rectangular triple bay window. Windows have mock shingled spandrels. The hip, bullnosed verandah is in the angle, with a spindle palisade valence and fretwork brackets to turned posts. Eaves have ogee brackets and frieze mould. Chimneys have red moulded bricks and pots.

SIGNIFICANCE: A Late Victorian timber house built in 1901. It is architecturally significant locally as a characteristic survival of the architectural manner of the Late Victorian period, although actually built in the early twentieth century and only a few years before the distinctively Edwardian style house at no. 10 (ref. 65). It is historically significant as a representative embodiment of family life at the turn of the century.

INTACTNESS: Very good. The fence is appropriate, but appears recent.

CONDITION: Very good. Sub-floor ventilation.
