

HISTORY: Like its neighbour at 51 George Street, this house was built in 1923. Susan Harvie is listed as owner of a block of land upon which a timber house was built at a cost of £850 (\$1,700). Harvie was still listed as owner in 1940. At that time the house had a 'population' of three people.¹


VISUAL DESCRIPTION: A timber, double-fronted Californian Bungalow, with a gable roof across. The right bay projects as a gable, over the verandah. The upper gable has a rectangular vent and timbering over shingles splaying, supported on bull-nosed brackets, all on tuckpointed brick piers and balustrade. The entrance has a sidelight. The chimney is detached, with a terra-cotta pot. A skillion side window-hood is supported on timber brackets.

COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS: Nos 47, 49, 51 and 55 George Street. It is very similar to Nos. 51 and 55.

SIGNIFICANCE: A timber Californian Bungalow built in 1923. It is architecturally significant locally as a characteristic example of this domestic style and historically significant as a representative embodiment of family life in 1920s Newtown.

INTACTNESS: Excellent. The fence and garage are recent.

CONDITION & THREATS Excellent.
