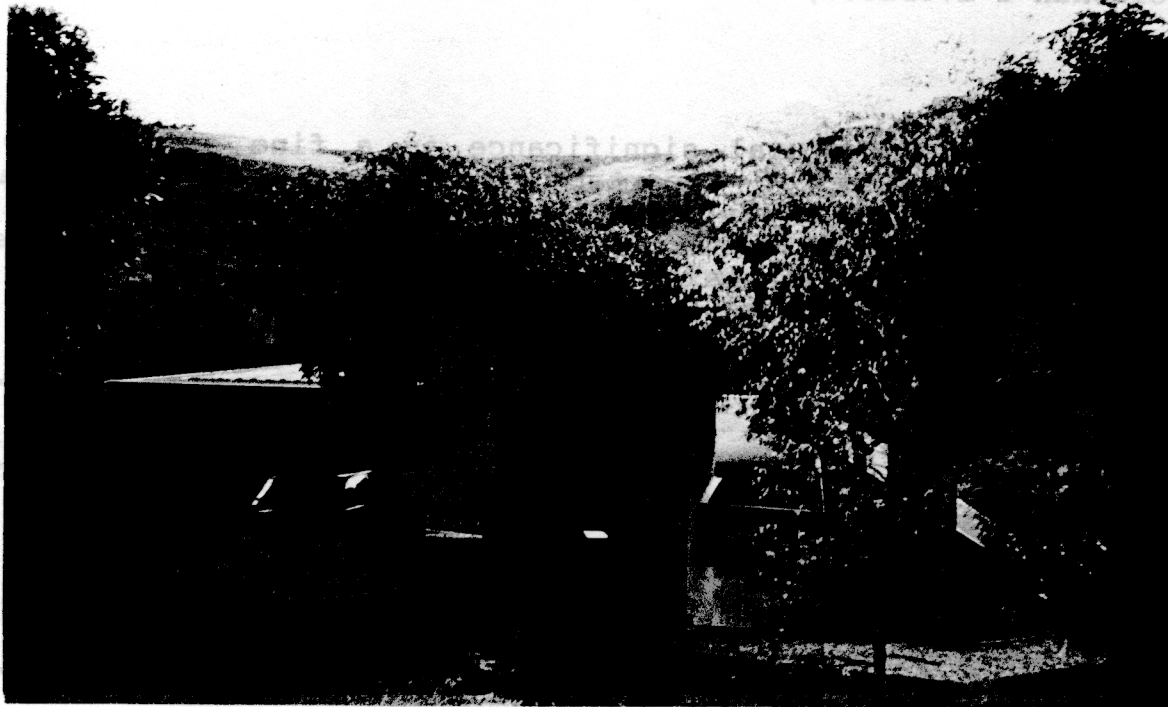

DESCRIPTION

On an unmade cul-de-sac, this contemporary house has mushroom concrete-block walls, some extending to form parapets. There are fragmented geometrical forms on various levels, with either 45° or flat pitch roofs and an open carport in front. Landscaped setting. (McGlashan & Everist?)

SIGNIFICANCE

Of Regional architectural significance as a fine modern (c1970?) design in the name of important local architects McGlashan & Everist. Of interest is the way the house utilises it's well landscaped site by cascading down the hillside in a sequence of terraced levels, taking maximum advantage of the view across the Barwon Valley.
